Thank you for joining us during HTE's Reparations Season. Reparations Season is an initiative that invites community members into a practice of receiving and reallocating wealth to impact the wellbeing of professionals in the workplace. For the past three years, Harriet Tubman Effect and D.E.I. Director, Nicole Johnson have sought to create the tools necessary for impactful equity work in the theater industry. Every week Harriet Tubman Effect receives 10-15 calls or inquiries about workplace trauma, mental health needs and systemic oppression challenges from marginalized leaders and DEIA minded professionals in the theater industry. We are often supporting professionals in between jobs and throughout their healing post wrongful termination, discrimination and burnout.

In addition to our workplace trauma resources, we directly support a growing list of BIPOC professionals by connecting them with needed social capital, direct financial aid, mental health resources and free professional coaching.

Those who contribute to Harriet Tubman Effect participate in a community that is dedicated to making American industries more equitable, diverse, accessible and inclusive. In order to continue this impact we believe industry professionals must to stay in conversation with each other. Therefore, we have created this special Setting the Table Event to deepen our relationships in partnership with our dedicated partner and client, MCC Theater. We are so grateful for their contribution to Harriet Tubman Effect and deeply proud of the impact they are making in this industry.

Our work is rooted in a spirit of historical justice advocacy; Tubman and countless others have instilled within us the courage to not only run toward our due freedom, but to also liberate our communities along the way. Lantern Fund Initiatives

The lantern in LANTERN FUND represents our commitment to lighting pathways toward freedom. A lantern on a house during the early 1800s indicated that a safe house on the Underground Railroad was "all clear," or ready to receive someone on their journey as they escaped to the north. We believe the lanterns of modern day show up in many ways: seats in our theatres, workplace support funding, and mental health resources. Lantern Fund



The Lantern Fund provides pathways for BIPOC professionals to receive wealth and resources from HTE community members and theater industry at large. The services listed above provide sustainable tools and resources to people of color who are challenged and quieted by institutions and systemic oppression. The Fund is one of HTE's reallocation of wealth practices and is an opportunity for people with privilege to redistribute their wealth to these marginalized groups. Besides contributing financial wealth, HTE also uses the Lantern Fund to reallocate and share social, knowledge, health and time wealth to communities in need. In the past it has funded free networking events, educational seminars, affordable Broadway tickets, free mental health and executive coaching for BIPOC and marginalized individuals.

Reparations Season Testimonies

"It's funny, "reparations". Usually when we talk about reparations it's about a perpetrator giving something to the one who harmed. Although in a few instances, reparations have been given by perpetrators to certain groups of people based on the acts committed against them and their ancestors, it seems Black people in America are still waiting for theirs (ours) over 159 years later. Instead of waiting in hopes for things to change and for reparations to be given by the perpetrators of slavery in America, The Harriet Tubman Effect (HTE), started by Nicole Johnson, a Black woman, has led the charge towards radical reparations for Black people in America. I was introduced to Nicole by a mutual friend in the summer of 2022 and by the fall of 2022, I started helping black and brown individuals overcome mental health issues, mainly predicated on racial discrimination and prejudice. Those who were referred to me, directly from Nicole, received pro bono sessions and I received a fee. So although Reparations Season officially began at HTE in 2024, reparations were already happening by the organization in 2022. Dozens of people's lives have been affected positively, with their mental health improving from the services I have offered and I too have been affected positively from the financial support. And ultimately, this is what "reparations" is about -- the sharing of resources and beneficial fulfilment for all those involved." - Kadeem


