

The Lantern Library is a pop up museum and multi-faceted education experience for guests who are interested in dismantling systemic oppression. The Lantern Library is designed to help leaders engage with stories of the past to help our problem solving and equity work of the future and to provide BIPOC leaders a space to network, share their work, showcase themselves and recruit employment opportunities. The Lantern Library serves as an orchestrated network for the practice of reallocating wealth across identities and professions.

The communal library includes historical curated exhibits and modern day commentary on dismantling systemic oppression efforts in our industries. Reading nooks, physical books and media with headphones for guest exploration.



Our entertainment and artistic events give our community outlets and platforms to showcase their work and participate in artistic collaboration. Our productions include play readings, puppetry, poetry slams, live music, open mics and children's book readings.

Our education seminars fall under three categories, healing, advocacy and history. Guests can engage in egalitarian style facilitated sessions that offer best practices, strategies and information for sustainability in dismantling systemic oppression. In partnership with HTE clients, Lantern Libraries are hosted at donated schools, theaters, company lobbies, outdoor parks, etc.
